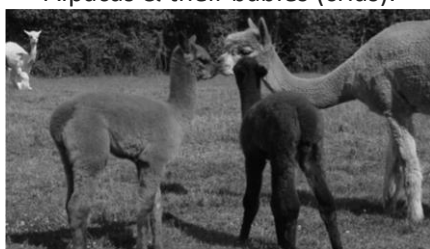

Dog waste bin: Our first dog waste bin has been installed for T & E Parish Council at Church Road, Theberton. Under a contract with East Suffolk Council, the bin will be emptied weekly.
